

**Philosophy of Religion**

**PURPOSE:** This course surveys the philosophy behind the origins and developments of primal, Eastern, and Western religions. Topics include the comparison and contrast of concepts such as Western theism and Eastern pantheism, salvation and enlightenment, faith and mystical experience, and the sky gods and earth goddesses of ancient hunting and planting societies. The crosscultural exploration of human beliefs will also include discussions regarding contemporary religion in America and potential future roles religion might play in our culture.

**READINGS:** Ninian Smart's *Worldviews* and Mary Pat Fisher's *Religion in the Twenty-first Century*.

1. Describe the evolution of Hinduism into its three major periods. Include major concepts and scripture that exemplify this evolution.
2. Describe the evolution of the yin and yang concepts through the World Parents myths and the I Ching to the Tao Te Ching.
3. Discuss the four schools of Buddhism and their major differences and similarities.

III. Major essay (40 points).

1. Describe the relationship of nature, humans, and the divine as it is expressed through similar concepts and doctrines of Hinduism, Taoism, and Buddhism.
